

Fact Sheet Bed Bugs

Bed Bugs are not the easiest of pests to treat and they are becoming more and more of a problem particularly in the summer months, this is not just throughout the UK but the rest of the world also suffers with this pest.



Unfortunately Bed Bugs are very easily spread and are difficult to treat which results in the rapid growth in the number of infestations, however with safe, efficient and rapid elimination they can be dealt with safely and sufficiently

The key to beating a bedbug problem is to be aware of them and get them treated as soon as possible once they have been discovered. The living condition of your home has nothing to do with an infestation, if you are exposed to Bed Bugs you can bring them home quickly and soon have an infestation as they breed at a phenomenal rate.

Washing your bedding on high temperatures and throwing away furniture will unfortunately still not eradicate this from your property. How Do You Get A Bedbug Infestation?

On your bedding you will start to notice small blood spots and you may see some tiny husks on your bedding and mattress, you will also start getting bitten, with itchiness and some small inflammation

Bedbugs can be brought into your home quite easily; travel is widely recognized as the most common cause of Bedbugs.

Will Bedbugs Spread From Room To Room?

Can You See Bedbugs?

Should I Sleep In Another Room If I Have Bedbugs?

The adult size of a Bedbug is approximately 4 to 7 mm long, so you should be able to see them with the naked eye, they are brown or red in colour and oval shaped or flat.

These pests will not go away if you sleep in another room as they will follow you and create new colonies.

Should I Throw Away My Mattress If I Have Bedbugs?

Do Bedbugs Hide During The Day?

No there is no point in doing this as soon as the Bedbugs have been professionally treated you will be bedbug free

During the day they tend to hide in cracks or crevices within your room and come out to feed on their hosts during the night when they are most active.

Pyrethrins and pyrethroids: These are the most commonly used pesticides for bed bug treatment. Pyrethrins are derived from chrysanthemum flowers, and pyrethroids are the synthetic equivalent. They act on the nervous system of the bugs. Some bed bug populations have become resistant to these chemicals, especially older-generation products.

Silicates: These include diatomaceous earth dust (DED). They are desiccants. They destroy the bed bugs' waxy, protective outer coating and kill them through dehydration. The effects are physical, not neurochemical, so the bugs cannot become resistant to these products.

Insect growth regulators (IGRs): Examples include (S)-methoprene and hydroprene. The insects must bite for blood before the pesticides take effect. This makes them an unattractive option.

Carbamates: Examples include bendiocarb and propoxur. They are more effective than pyrethrins and pyrethroids, but cases of resistance are emerging.

Neonicotinoids: Examples include imidacloprid. These have been found to produce no resistance and are effective. They have no residual effect.
